Gregg's involvement with BSCA dates back to 1993 with his participation in the Sister City Staff Exchanges. In 1995 he was the first City of Bellevue staff exchange representative to the City of Kladno and has hosted delegates visiting Bellevue. He has served as Kladno committee chair and as BSCA vice-president. We appreciate his stepping up to finish Hugh's term and beyond.

Gregg has been with the City of Bellevue for 25 years, presently the Building Official and Building Division Director. He is a licensed structural engineer and a former director of the Structural Engineers Association of Washington (SEAW). Gregg has participated in writing and grading structural licensing exams for 20



years at the state and national level, worked as a volunteer engineer for the City of Los Angeles following the 1994 Northridge Earthquake, and joined the SEAW/UW post-earthquake reconnaissance teams that went to China in 2008 and Chile in 2010. Gregg was also a member of the King County Emergency Management Advisory Committee for 6 years.

His personal interests are travel, reading, bicycling, tennis, hiking, bridge, and chess. In his travels, Gregg has visited 34 countries on 5 continents – including participating in three BSCA delegation visits.
