Again, this summer we enjoyed getting together at our Annual picnic—and we were glad to be back at the Bellevue Botanical Garden! We were joined by our Kladno exchange students as well as the parents of one of our Yao students. Later we enjoyed a second get-together—this time on the shores of Lake Washington—to visit with our Yao students and their families.



For most of us, the summer student exchange is the most important part of what we support and what we like best of all is to hear from some of our past students that the friendships they formed during these exchanges lead to many further visits—and those often also include other family members!

This year's exchange brings the number of students who have enjoyed this experience to 112. Bellevue and Yao became sister cities back in 1969 and not long after the student exchanges began... the first in 1977. Exchanges with Hualien came soon after it became our second sister city in 1984. When Liepaja and Klandno came on board we had several busy years—in 2001 all of 8 students participated!

In recent years, with our funds declining, we've mostly stayed with one student to each city—but even that will soon be in jeopardy if we don't have some fundraisers...

Kladno Mayor visits Bellevue



The City of Bellevue and the Bellevue Sister City Association hosted the Lord Mayor of Kladno, Czech Republic, Dan Jiránek and his wife Ivana Jiránkova, from July 21 through July 28. A reception was held at Bellevue City Hall the afternoon of Tuesday, July 22, at which time the mayor and his wife were welcomed by Bellevue City Councilmembers Jennifer Robertson, Conrad Lee, and Lynne Robinson. Among those present were Wayne Jehlik, Honorary Consul of the Czech Republic in Seattle, Brad Miyake, Bellevue City Manger, several Bellevue staff and BSCA members. Later that evening Bellevue Mayor Claudia Bal-

ducci among the guests at a dinner hosted by Susan Harper.

The Mayor's scheduled activities included an urban planning tour of new development and rezoned areas, an overview of the light-rail extension planned through Bellevue, a parks and facilities tour, and discussions with the budget office and the Public Records Manager. On Wednesday, July 23, the Mayor had lunch with the Microsoft Government Affairs Director, Irene Plenefisch, Bellevue Downtown Association Land Use Committee Co-chair, Mark D'Amato of D'Amato Conversano Engineers, and Larry Martin, Partner at the Davis Wright Tremaine law firm.



On Thursday, July 24, Emil King, City of Bellevue Strategic Planning Manager, and Gregg Schrader, Bellevue Sister City

Association President, joined Mayor Jiránek and his wife Ivana for a meeting at the Amazon offices in Seattle with the following company officials: John Felton, VP, Worldwide Operations Finance, Akash Chauhan, VP, Worldwide Supply Chain and Process Standardization, Tony Boetto, Program Manager, Economic Development.

There were interesting discussions about the facility currently located in Kladno that serves the German market for processing returned items, the plans to add another facility at the same site that will



be approximately five times larger, Amazon's interest in recruiting employees in that area, Czech technical schools that train potential employees, the possibility of launching a Czech language Amazon site, the perception of the company in the Czech Republic, and proactive public relations communication with Czech communities where facilities are located.

On Friday, July 25 through Sunday, July 27, the mayor and his wife toured the Bellevue Arts Fair, downtown Seattle, the Space Needle and the Chihuly Glass Museum at the Seattle Center, and hiked to the High Rock Lookout south of Mount

Rainier. A farewell reception was held at the Seastar Restaurant in Bellevue on Friday evening, July 25, which was attended by Wayne Jehlik, Honorary Consul of the Czech Republic in Seattle, and Bellevue Councilmember Jennifer Robertson, with her husband Scott Robertson. *Report by Gregg Schrader*
