I like to volunteer and be involved with my community through RYPAC, the Redmond Youth Partnership Advisory Council, where we put on benefit concerts at the local teen center and volunteer at school events. She recently led a young girls support group called GoGirlGo, and hosted the





Girl's Unlimited conference also through the City of Redmond. She is looking forward to showing Eva all around Seattle and the great Pacific Northwest.

Eva is the only child of Radek and Marta Petrželka of Kladno. Her passion is traveling, meeting new people and discovering their habits and their culture. Her hobbies also include reading, writing, and karate. She is eager to show Karlie her country, because even though the Czech Republic is very small and often forgotten, she thinks it is a country with a very colorful history and folklore. On arrival she has been amazed at the diversity of our population. There are so many people of different cultures, ethnicities, languages...we do not have as much multiculturality back home, and it is very fascinating to observe how these different people get along. Another thing that she finds different from her country, and even from the rest of Europe, is the amount of new buildings and the absence of the historical ones. In the Czech Republic you can find

plenty of medieval castles, baroque halls, renaissance palaces etc. In the US, everything is new, which is what gives it an entirely different atmosphere. All these differences but also the surprising similarities make me stand in awe sometimes and I am very excited about a month full of discovering Seattle, Bellevue, and Redmond.

Grand Opening for Liepaja's New Concert Hall

On our walk through Liepaja during our 2013 delegation visit our hosts pointed out the site where construction was just beginning of their major project - the "Lielais Dzintars" or the Giant Amber as the new multipurpose cultural center is to be called.

The project was first proposed in 2002 and approved by the Liepaja City Council to solicit project ideas. The winner - an Austrian architectural firm - was announced in 2004 - but it took until 2011 to complete the planning and assure the financing for the project - half cofinanced with European Union funding.
