Caring for the Children of Liepaja Dr. Zaiga Alksnis Phillips

It was at the instigation and due to the efforts of Dr. Zaiga Phillips along with many in the Seattle area Latvian community and BSCA members that led Bellevue and Liepaja to their sister city partnership - one formalized in 1992. As a pediatrician, it is no surprise that much of Dr. Phillips attention was on providing for children - and even before the sister city relationship was official, BSCA members were helping her collect books and medical supplies to be shipped to Liepaja.

We are all aware of Zaiga's contributions to our teacher exchange and playground projects at the Liepaja Special School. But she has done much more - it was Zaiga who along with



Gunars Jaunzems, a Liepaja pediatrician, forged a relationship with Healing the Children that led to 20 Liepaja children receiving surgical help in the US. She was also involved in sending medical teams to Liepaja - she herself part of the first team - that provided medical help to over 300 children. But Zaiga's efforts were not limited to Liepaja, she has been involved in many projects to bring needed supplies and updated medical procedures to Latvia.

Her contributions have been recognized - in 2005 she received the Three Star CROSS OF RECOGNI-TION presented by the president of Latvia.

Meet Deputy City Manager Nathan McCommon

Recently BSCA president, Gregg Schrader, spent some time chatting with Nathan McCommon who, as of last October, joined Mary Kate Berens as Deputy City Manager. According to Brad Miyake, McCommon "stood out through his broad managerial experience in public service and practical knowledge of serving the public at the street level" referring to his having worked as a garbage collector, parks maintenance worker and traffic signal technician prior to attending the University of Kansas graduating with a BA in Spanish literature and a Masters in Public Administration. Since 1990 he has worked in municipal service for local governments the last of which were as City Manager, Tonganoxie, KS and as Senior Management Analyst and Convention and Entertainment Facilities Manager, Kansas City, MO. During his time in Kansas City, he was also involved with their Sister

City Program - Kansas City having 13 Sister Cities around the world - including Kurashiki in Japan and Tainan City in Taiwan. We hope to have him on board at BSCA.


BELLEVUE - HUALIEN ... a second Sister City

The year was 1981 when Timber and Fumiko Lin immigrated to the US with hopes of better life for their four children - Eureka at 20 the oldest. They settled in Bellevue and bought into a printing business - Bellevue Printing and Graphics. Not long after, they were contacted by the mayor of Hualien for help in establishing a new sister city in the US - these bilateral relationships provided by sister cities seen as an essential link in U.S.-Taiwan relations. Since the first sister city partnership between Taipei and Houston, TX in 1961 new sister city pairs had been regularly added and Bellevue had been identified a good fit with Hualien. (Seattle-Kaohsiung (1991) and Tacoma-Taichung (2000) came later).

By then Timber had joined the Bellevue Rotary and found help in approaching the City of Bellevue in his partner and fellow Rotarian, Harry McVey.

Finding the City Council and BSCA open to the idea, there followed many conversations - Eureka often doing the translating. 1n 1984 a delegation from Hualien arrived in Bellevue (Hualien Mayor Chen Chin Shui with BSCA members Arthur Webb and Jim Forrester pictured) that led to formalizing the partnership in June 23, 1984.

from Bellevue headed for its first visit to Hualien in 1985 - led by then BSCA president Patrcia Swerda and then Bellevue Mayor Don Davidson. They were welcomed in Hualien by Hulien city staffalng with members of the press. BSCA

Exchanging gifts is a long time Sister City tradition, the first gift from Hualien to the City of Bellevue a pair of the Foo Dogs that guard the entries to Chinese homes - Bellevue City council thought two was too many - and so one Foo Dog arrived - seen here as then Hualien Mayor Wei Mu Chun, Bellevue Mayor Nan Campbell, Councilmember Don Davidson and TECO Chief Secretary Li Shi Ming look on at its arrival. For many years this 'old bachelor' guarded the entry to the old city hall (the present location of the Lexus dealership). It took two decades and the persistence of Councilmember Conrad Lee, to realize that Foo Dogs ALWAYS come in pairs - a male and a female, and the arrival of a new pair from Hualien

- you will find them keeping guard these days on the City Hall plaza.
