
## Welcome the Chinese New Year Lunch Program by Students of the NW Association of Chinese Language Schools

The Year Ahead — As you will read up front in this newsletter, we are starting January 2013 in an unusual way. Instead of holding our first general membership meeting in City Hall on the second Tuesday, we



will take advantage of our local Taiwan community's gearing up to celebrate the Chinese New Year by accepting the kind offer of the Taiwan Economic and Cultural Office (TECO) to stage a special program of cultural activity for us. This will be at their Bellevue center half way between the Crossroads area and Bellevue's downtown, just off 8th Avenue NE.

Those of us who have been BSCAers for ten years or more will recall the delightful and varied all-Chinese program that our Hualien committee put on earlier in the 2000s, also in January. Or, more recently in early Fall of last year, the general membership meeting where the Hualien Committee treated us to a demonstration and exhibit of Chinese calligraphy. Easily reminders of the rich depth of Chinese culture, which was flourishing about the time long ago when classical Greek culture also flourished.

We may look forward, too, to more activity on Chinese themes later this year. For, with good help from the City staff, we have a breakthrough on installing and dedicating the "Foo Dogs" that have sat patiently for so long in storage after being gifted to Bellevue by Hualien City and its sister-city activists. We hope to see a visit by the Hualien mayor and his aides at the dedication, at a date still to be determined.

Many of you shared with us the special 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration in December at City Hall of our Bellevue-Liepaja affiliation. So, to properly round out the year's programming we should also hope that the Yao and Kladno committees will get creative and develop suitable programs for the benefit and enjoyment of our members at upcoming general meetings.

### Bellevue-Liepaja Sister City 20 year Celebration

December 14th was an evening to remember our commitment with Liepaja, Latvia since 1992. Among the more than 70 guests many had ties to the very beginnings—past City Manger Phil Kushlan who, along with then Councilmember Terry Lukens were part of the first delegation to Liepaja, as well as Councilmember and past mayor Don Davidson. Dorothy Webb, BSCA president back in 1992 presented Bellevue Mayor Conrad Lee with 4 international dolls—one for each or our Sister Cities. Present were also Councilmember Claudia Balducci, who along with then Councilmember Grant Degginger, led our last delegation visit to Liepaja, her husband, and Kathy Degginger.

We were pleased to see several past staff exchange to Liepaja—Kathy Barker, Paul Cornish, Ian Toms, Barbara Ramey as well as several other Bellevue staff members. As also present was Juris Jansons, who, along with Lucien Holmes our first exchange student —visited Liepaja in 1994.

Letters of congratulations were also read from past Liepaja Mayor Imants Vismins who came to Bellevue in 1992, Talivaldis Deklaus and Miervaldis Ziemelis, both teachers who received books and computer programs from BSCA.

### ... and our next 20 year Celebration... Bellevue-Kladno, Czech Republic

The ink had barely dried on the Liepaja- Bellevue proclamation when it was time again to bring out the flags and receive the next delegation. In April 1993 a delegation from Kladno—Mayor Marie Bednorova, accompanied by several City Council members arrived in Bellevue. There followed receptions, visits and on April 5th, the official signing of the proclamation by then Bellevue Mayor Cary Bozeman and Kladno Mayor Marie Bednorova making it official—Kladno in the Czech Republic became Bellevue's second European Sister City.

Over these many years BSCA members and friends have visited Kladno on delegation trips as well as

met with Kladno officials and Kladno Sister City members when visiting the Czech Republic. Since 1994 Bellevue and Kladno students have participated in the BSCA Summer Student Exchange program, as well as Kladno and Bellevue Staff have spent time in each other's cities sharing their expertise and

experiencing a different culture.



Kladno also has a very active Sister City Association and we have had the pleasure of hosting some of their members, as well as being royally received by them. Not least have been the personal friendships that have followed the official visits—many of the Kladno committee members have had the pleasure of hosting their Czech friends on return visits to Bellevue.

## From the Liepaja Special School

Among the many greetings the Liepaja committee received was one from Dace Kreismane, the Special School parent who has been the lead on our Ann Knofel playground. Two years after her visit here, she says she's still in a 'long term shock" - her experience changed her outlook so much—gave her self-confidence and a more hopeful view of the future. Although finding funding to finish the playground project has not been fruitful, through her pursuit of grant money and other sources of support she has met many people to whom she can turn for advice and help. The parent organization 'Hope, Faith, Love' has been active in finding ways to open doors for their children—and have seen a change in the attitude of Liepaja people to their sons and daughters. Their efforts have been rewarded by access to music and folklore teachers, and they hope to take the students for swimming instruction. On a personal note, she says son Karlis is taking accordion lessons and loves it. Their efforts have been noticed—the group was one of five most active groups cited by the City of Liepaja.
